OAs eager to impress Ealing RFC on Sunday 3rd February 2008

It was a pleasure to host visitors from Ealing RFC on another bright and cold winter's morning. Ealing are a big club with a formidable reputation - I was told that their As and Bs rarely lose to anyone! The games were played to a very high standard with our teams showing the visitors a thing or two. Our OAs under 9s dominated the morning with our teams winning 7 of the 11 games played. This is a fine achievement considering some of our players were missing through illness or participation in other events elsewhere. Congratulations to all the players and coaches.

Next week the Blues and Reds entertain an additional fixture with Tring A and Bs whilst the Yellows and Greens enjoy a hard earned chance to get some time on the training pitch.

As we hit two thirds of the way through the season it is a good time to pause and assess how well our players are doing this season.

I would like to congratulate 5 players with 100% attendance records for the season - **Zach West, Jonathan Powdrell, Adam Ford, Cameron Clark** and **Ethan Arpino**. I am also, however, delighted that 15 more players have almost perfect attendance of 95% and another 9 players have attended 90% of sessions. This means that across the age group around **half of the players have attended more than 90% of sessions** - this is a great achievement and relates to how our teams are managing to continually improve each week. The players are showing great loyalty and are learning that what they get out of their game comes from what they put into it!

In terms of games played, as a whole age group we have played 75 games against 13 clubs and won 50 of the games. The **Greens** have beaten all D squads and some C's they have played. The **Yellows** have beaten all D's, most C's and some B's. The **Reds** have beaten all D's, all C's, most B's and some A squads. The **Blues** are unbeaten so far over 20 games. This is a remarkable record and not many clubs can boast an age group with these results.

Lastly, across all squads we have scored 282 tries and conceded 153. The Blues have done particularly well having scored 120 tries and only conceded 8 - defence is the key!

These records show **how strong all our under 9 squads are** and how well the players and coaches are doing this season. Every player in every position and in every squad is improving and producing results to prove it. **Well done everybody.**

A very bright start from the Blues in the first game of the day saw an early score for **Captain Cameron Clark** on a trade mark solo run. Ealing were by far the best bunch of forwards we have faced all year and every ruck was a contest. Our forwards stood toe to toe in this game with **Ed Birchinnall** and **Archie Radovanovic** both putting a very strong game together.

Ealing did not really threaten our line due to a massive improvement to the soft tacking that we saw last week against Harpenden. Although not a part of the game that gets much focus in these reports every player took responsibility for tacking the player they were marking and **Captain Clark** organised the line to ensure we kept Ealing on the back foot.

In one passage of play **Archie Radovanovic** crushed an Ealing runner only to be absolutely pancaked when he took the turnover ball forward. The key throughout all the contact was the ball retention, only one loose pass all game and very few knock-ons and dropped balls was a sign of the high quality play the team was producing.

With the Blues winning the arm wrestle the difference was **Cameron Clark**, first to the tackle and ruck he also scored a hat-trick for good measure. At one point one of the Ealing coaches pushed a maul back away from touch onto the pitch to give his boys a boost. However, despite a late consolation score it was all one way traffic.
